Key Points

Council and Mayor dismissed and replaced by 4 Commissioners

March 2022 – Commissioners term extended until July 2024, another 21 months longer than originally intended. Unfettered decision making no accountability continues.

Rate increase 13.7% projected for 2022/2023


All these changes and committed projects will lead to ever increasing rates which any future democratically elected council will have no chance of reining in and stopping.
